<p>Monday- Tic Tac Math- Draw a traditional tic tac toe board. Fill the spaces in with math problems using either addition, subtraction, multiplication, or division. In order to put an X or O in the space, the player must first answer the math problem correctly. Have fun!!</p>	<p>Reflex</p>
<p>Tuesday- Double Dice Multiplication- You need two dice to play this game. The first player rolls the two dice and multiplies those numbers. The second player rolls the two dice and multiplies their numbers. The player with the highest answer, wins a point. You can play as long as you like, and the highest score wins.</p>	<p>Dreambox</p>
<p>Wednesday- Higher or Lower- One person will pick a number between 1-1000. The other person will start to guess what the number could be, but there only clues that will be given are higher or lower. For example if the number is 500 and the person guesses 400, you can simply answer higher. Play until the number is guessed, then switch roles.</p>	
<p>Thursday- Multiples Race- Choose a number to write the multiples for. Give one minute, and the person who writes the most multiples for the given number wins the game.</p>	
<p>Friday- 57. Twenty Questions Number Game-</p> <p>IT selects a number within the range to be played, e.g. 1- 20, 1-100, 100-1000. The number is written on a piece of paper but not shown to the others. The other players then ask questions to help them to identify the number. Only yes/no questions can be asked. HINT – Encourage children to ask general questions to begin with, e.g. Is it odd? Is it higher than 50? instead of guessing the number, e.g. Is it 38?</p>
