Kindergarten Registration Week



Registration for children entering Kindergarten in September 2014 will be held from October 15th-18th at your community school. Parents are reminded that Kindergarten attendance in 2014-2015 is compulsory for children born in 2009, except if a child is born between September 1st and December 31st of that year. These children have the option of starting Kindergarten the following year. If you have a child entering

Kindergarten next year, please call the school at 778-6099 or visit the main office between 8:30 am-3:00 pm to have him or her registered. Proof of immunization, birth certificate and Medicare cards are required at the time of registration. It is important that your child be registered at this time in order to receive information needed for pre-school screening and successful transition into school for September 2014.
